DAY 5 TEMPE-MESA-APACHE JUNCTION

Depart Tempe for Mesa. The drive is 7 miles or 11.2 km. Mesa is a city that knows no bounds, known for family fun and outdoor attractions.

Explore Arizona's colorful mining history at the Goldfield Ghost Town in the Superstition Mountains. Back in the 1980's, Goldfield was booming, after more than 115 years, travelers from all over the world still visit this gold mining town located on the historic Apache Trail.

Drive the Apache Trail (AZ-88) to Canyon Lake or Tortilla Flat. The Apache Trail is one of the most popular day trips in the Phoenix-Metro area. The trail is a scenic route that winds between Apache Junction and Theodore Roosevelt Lake, and through the Superstition Mountains area. With gorgeous, desert views of the Tonto National Forest unlike any other, the Apache Trail is the perfect outdoor excursion. The trail is unpaved starting 5.5 miles past Tortilla Flat. Canyon Lake is home to the **Dolly Steamboat**, which offers daytime nature cruises and dinner cruises at twilight. Tortilla Flat is a former stagecoach stop that exudes Old West charm.

Return to Mesa. The drive is 24.7 miles or 39.8 km.



Mesa visitors can also explore the Fresh Foodie Trail®. Come hungry and take the ultimate roadtrip full of Arizona flavors on the award-winning Fresh Foodie Trail®. This in-demand collection of culinary outposts in the shape of farms, citrus groves, peach orchards, an olive mill, wheat fields and more has delights in store for every taste bud. Stops include Queen Creek Olive Mill, True Garden Urban Farm, and Schnepf Farms.

For a fun adventure try glamping at the Cozy Peach. Located on Mesa's famous Schnepf Farms, known for their u-pick peaches, this stop along the Fresh Foodie Trail® has eight rentable airstreams all decorated in unique themes.
