


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The People and Places of Route 66

DAY 1 PHOENIX-HOLBROOK-WINSLOW

Morning: Drive from Phoenix to Holbrook. The drive is 185 miles or 297.7 km.

Photo stop at <u>The Wigwam Motel</u>. The Wigwam Motels, were a motel chain in the United States during the 30s and 40s. The rooms were built in the form of tepees. Tel: (928) 524-3048 • 811 W Hopi Drive, Holbrook, AZ 86025



DAY 2 WINSLOW-FLAGSTAFF

Morning: Drive to <u>Meteor Crater</u>. The drive is 26 miles or 41.8 km. Located in Northern AZ, learn about the world's best preserved meteor impact site. Tel: (800) 289-5898 • Interstate 40, Winslow, AZ 86047

In Flagstaff embark on a downtown Route 66 walking tour. End the walking tour with a pint of local craft beer brewed in a historic building on Flagstaff's original alignment of Route 66 at Mother Road Brewing Company, one of several breweries along Flagstaff's Ale Trail. 

DAY 3 WILLIAMS-SELIGMAN-KINGMAN



Morning: Drive to <u>Williams</u>, a town centered around a historic train depot. Route 66 history buffs can wander the six blocks of historic buildings and shops.

Drive to Bearizona for a wildlife tour. Bearizona is a North American wildlife park that allows visitors to drive into the wilderness and witness herd and pack life from the safety and comfort of their private vehicle. Tel: (928) 635-2289 • 1500 Historic Rte 66, Williams, AZ 86046

Drive from Williams to <u>Seligman</u> for a self-guided walking tour. The drive is 42.8 miles or 68.9 km.

Have lunch at Delgadillo's Snow Cap. The Snow Cap is cherished by tourists for the antics pulled on them while they try to order food and drinks. It is one of the wackiest, off-beat burger joints around. Tel: (928) 422-3291 • 301 AZ-66, Seligman, AZ 86337

Tour the <u>Grand Canyon Caverns</u>. A natural limestone cavern 210 ft. underground and the largest dry cavern in the U.S. For those seeking a unique dining experience, the <u>Cavern Grotto</u>, lets you dine below the Earth's surface. Tel: (928) 422-3223 • MM 115 AZ-66, Peach Springs, AZ 86434

Along the way, from Grand Canyon Caverns to <u>Kingman</u>, make a photo stop at <u>Hackberry General Store</u>. Hackberry is a scenic photo stop and gift shop, with lots of signs and old cars. Hackberry is at Milepost 80. Tel: (928) 769-2605 • 11255 AZ-66, Kingman, AZ 86411

Evening: Dinner at <u>Mr. D'z Route 66 Diner</u>. Vintage Americana decorates this Route 66 diner serving burgers and shakes from their vinyl record shaped menus . Tel: (928) 718-0066 • 105 E. Andy Devine Ave, Kingman, AZ 86401

Overnight in Kingman at <u>Rodeway Inn</u>. This historic Kingman hotel is full of Route 66 memorabilia throughout with several rooms named and themed for celebrities who have stayed there such as Dorothy Devine, Gene Hackman, and Pamela Anderson, to name a few. DAY 4 KINGMAN-OATMAN

Morning: Breakfast at <u>Hualapai Mountain Resort</u>. Among the cool pines you can enjoy majestic views through the restaurant's big picture windows perfect for wildlife viewing. Tel: (928) 757-3545 • 4525 Hualapai Mtn. Rd, Kingman, AZ 86401

Drive from Kingman to Oatman. The drive is 28.6 miles or 46 km.

On the way, stop for a picture at the <u>Cool Springs Station</u>. There is a Route 66 shield painted in the road. On the long stretch of road, it's safe to walk out and grab a photo. Tel: (928) 768-8366 • 8275 W. Oatman Rd, Kingman, AZ 86413

Afternoon: Roam around <u>Oatman</u>. A former mining town located in the Black Mountains of Arizona, Oatman was all but abandoned by the 1960s after the gold mines closed. Today, Oatman has undergone a renaissance of sorts and wild burros (donkeys) freely roam the town.

Make sure to grab a famous date shake at one of the Oatman dining establishments. The area is known for farming Medjool dates and when they are boiled, smashed and blended with vanilla ice cream they make a perfect road-trip treat.

Depart Oatman for Phoenix. The drive is 222.9 miles or 356.9 km.
