Christmas in the Park at the Sedona Heritage Museum **Saturday, December 14th 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** FREE Holiday Part in the historic Jordan home!

The Sedona Heritage Museum is hosting their annual "Christmas in the Park" open house on Saturday, December 14th from 11:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. The event extends free admission to the museum as a holiday gift to residents and guests. During the day visitors will be treated to hot apple cider, holiday cookies and free entertainment and activities. A fire will burn in the native stone fireplace of the old Jordan house and the museum will be decorated in vintage holiday decor. A tumbleweed 'snowman' will greet all visitors. Museum admission and all activities are free!

Sedona old-timers and descendants of local pioneer families will be in the Museum exhibit rooms telling stories about early Sedona, including Pat Schnebly Ceballos, Sedona Schnebly's granddaughter.

Guests are also invited to the activity room where volunteers will help them make a cornhusk doll. Red Rockappella choir will give a free holiday music concert at 1:30 p.m. in the historic Fruit Packing Shed. The shed is heated. Volunteers will demonstrate the vintage apple sorting machine. Other special activities and demos will occur throughout the day.

Holiday shopping in the Museum's Gift Shop will be a "must do", as you can take advantage of the shop's annual sale. The Gift Shop carries many items made by local artists and craftspeople, along with many gifts for both kids and adults.

The Sedona Historical Society operates the Sedona Heritage Museum, located in the Walter and Ruth Jordan home and fruit packing sheds, which are on the National Register of Historic Places.
